#### Budget Update: Our Monetary Goals

Recently, your executive met and discussed our budgetary hopes for the upcoming year. To show our transparency, here's a rough number estimate for the coming year.

Incoming Surplus: +\$2072

Resident House Fees Estimate: +\$6500

Honouraria Allocation: -\$2000

Orientation: -\$1455

Electric Circus: -\$1000 (\$2500 Budget - \$1500 Sales)

This leaves us with \$4177 for events and other costs. Granted, we hope to leave a similar surplus for next year and allot funds for house council roles. Even so, we will have plenty of room for your house event ideas.
